#### Pastor's Thoughts for May 2024

What is the month of May known for - April showers bring May flowers, Cinco de May, May 5th, Mother's Day, May 12th, and Memorial Day, May 27th are just a few things. May also brings Graduations and Baccalaureates. For the Christian Calendar it is also the celebration of the birth of the church - Pentecost.

May 19th is Pentecost Sunday, the day the disciples received the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit turned a small group of men who were fearful of their fate for following Jesus into men of courage going out to all the world and sharing the Good News of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. We claim this as the birth of the church. Traditionally we wear red for the color of the flame of the Holy Spirit that landed on each disciple's heads and gave them to ability to speak with passion about God's fulfilment of God's promised through Jesus the Christ.

The stories of Moses and the burning bush, Mount Sinai, the tabernacle, and the temple all include fire that shows up when God's presence arrives and marks his dwelling space or temple. In Acts 2, Luke is hyperlinking to these previous divine-fire scenes to give a background to the Pentecost story. The divine fire has previously rested on Yahweh's temple spaces, so where does it rest in this scene?

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a noise like a violent rushing wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire distributing themselves, and they rested on each one of them." Acts 2:1-3

It's a temple made out of "each one of them." It's made of people. People will meet with God not in a geographic place or constructed space but in connection with those who choose to trust and follow Jesus. God's fire shines with power and harms nobody, and it ignites a cosmic revolution, the Church.

#### PASS IT ON RESALE SHOP


